The NEA has been very impressed with the activities from the State of Alabama and has asked that Alabama serve as a pilot program for how other states can take The Big Read to a statewide level.



WHO:

ENTRANTS MUST BE MIDDLE-SCHOOL STUDENTS (GRADES 5-8) ENROLLED IN PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOLS OR HOMESCHOOLED IN JEFFERSON COUNTY.

HOW:

EACH PARTICIPATING SCHOOL WILL HOLD ITS OWN CONTEST AND SELECT THE TOP THREE POEMS FOR EACH DIVISION (JUNIOR: 5-6 GRADES AND SENIOR: 7-8 GRADES).

By <u>JANUARY 15, 2010</u>, the designated school contact for the contest will call 226-3670 or e-mail hm@bham.lib.al.us to sign up your school to participate.

- ♦ Each entrant may submit only one poem, which must be original, unpublished, and must not have won a previous award.
- ◆ Poem may be any form with a maximum length of 50 lines.
- ♦ Poem must be inspired by *The Adventures* of *Tom Sawyer* by Mark Twain or anything in your life or your imagination that resembles what Tom Sawyer or one of the characters in the book experienced. For example, you may write a poem about how you make work seem like fun or how someone tricked you (or you tricked them) into doing what you want. You may write about a scary person (like Injun Joe) or situation (like being in the cave or the grave-yard). You may write about first love or misunderstandings with a loved one. *Briefly state your inspiration or connection to the book*.
- ◆ Entries must be typed or computergenerated. Poems that take up more than one

page must be stapled. No artwork, graphics, or unusual type fonts. E-mail submissions will not be accepted.

 All work must be original, unpublished and by the student entrant only, without editing by parents, teachers or others. Joint submissions (2 or more authors) is not permitted.

- Also on the second copy the student MUST COPY AND SIGN THIS STATEMENT: "This is my original work and has not been copied in whole or part from any other author's work, including poems or songs posted on the Internet."
